Step 1: Storytellers expressing their experiences on a topic and authors capturing those stories.



► Step 2: Visual expressions of the storyteller's experiences through photography and art.



Step 3: Book publishing of stories, photography and art representing the storytellers.



Step 4: Book Launch and Live Event with artwork, dramatic readings and video story interpretations






